


A couple of items about the forthcoming Parish Council elections this month, both urging us to participate as fully as we can. For most, that will just mean turning out to vote, but we also need people to put themselves forward as candidates for the election on May 4th. If you feel that you have something to offer our community in that respect, then please think seriously about standing. At the last election in 2013 we had 5 candidates for 10 seats in Pensilva Ward, and 1 candidate for 3 seats in St Ive Ward. Surely we can do better than that! If you are thinking of standing you can ask the Parish Clerk for information about what is involved and how to go about standing. According to the Cornwall Council website, the Notice of Election will be published on Monday 20 March 2017 and candidate's nomination papers will need to be submitted by 4pm on Tuesday 4 April 2017. So potential candidates will probably need to do some of the groundwork in advance of the notice being published. See https://www.cornwall.gov.uk/council-and-democracy/ elections/current-and-forthcoming-electionsreferendums/

Cornwall Council seats will also be contested on May 4th. We have been going through a period of considerable upheaval on the international and national stage, but local issues are also important.

A letter from the St Ive Parish Council Chairman

I have been looking back through the records of the St Ive Parish Council to see what changes have occurred since my first joining the council in 2002. Over that period to date 36 people have volunteered their services as councillors, of those only two who held office in 2002 and three appointed since are still serving on the council. I hope you will forgive me if I say this is not entirely the result of natural wastage. It is far more likely for councillors to resign before completing their term of office. As a result the parish council has rarely been up to full strength and today has only five serving councillors out of a requirement of thirteen. While the council remains legally quorate and so continue to conduct business, it is hard to see this as a clear mandate for decision making. I must also mention that during the same period we have had no fewer than eight parish clerks, not including the three months I served in this capacity. The staff turnover here is particularly worrying as a lack of experience and continuity can have very serious consequences for public record keeping and the conduct of parish business.

From my experience there is a tendency to underestimate the nature of local politics where competing views and ideas collide and at times this can be bruising and a degree of resilience is necessary. Too many times it has proved easier to walk away. The implication here is that a single issue is what being a Councillor is about, the danger is it leaves those with other issues equally important to them unrepresented. The present council's term of office ends in May this year, when a new council must be elected. I would like to reflect on a number of issues concerning the forthcoming election. I know that many people believe that parish councils are relatively powerless and not worth bothering about, this is manifestly obvious in regard to planning matters which remain and will continue to remain the prerogative of Cornwall Council. On this point the Neighbourhood Plan does have influence over local planning decisions and the lack of participation and progress on this is very disappointing. Likewise there are many consultation documents passed down by County, which an under resourced parish council has little time to consider. Parish council's do have responsibility for parish assets and the St Ive Parish Council has more and larger assets than most as recent events have highlighted.

There can be no doubt that there will be more service devolution in the future as Cornwall Council continues to cut costs, or in this case pass the cost down to parishes. Some of you will know that there are plans to reduce the number of Cornwall Councillors, there is a suggestion that this will mean Cornwall Councillors no longer undertaking as much or any case work. The impact of this on parish councillors is something we should be thinking about. Far from being irrelevant I think parish councils are likely to become more important in the future.

Finally I would urge you take part in the democratic process in May and seriously consider standing for election as a parish Councillor. **David Waddington**

DRAMATIC EVENTS ON THE PARISH COUNCIL - AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CHANGE

Following the articles in last month's Pump about a series of resignations from the Parish Council, I thought I would write about how I see the way forward. I was one of the councillors that resigned over the Council's decision on the management of the Pensilva community centre. As I see it, the situation we now find ourselves in is a great opportunity to change things for the better.

I have been saying for some time that there is a pressing need for more local people to stand as councillors. That has now become even more urgent. Since co-options are not possible this close to the May elections, we have some time to engage in a proper debate about how the Parish Council can best represent the wishes of our community. Ideally, we need a minimum of 14 people to stand for the 13 seats, so that we can have a properly contested election. Within that number, my aim is that a group of like-minded people should stand together as independents, but under a common, community-minded platform.

An important piece of the work to be done will be to heal the split within the parish over Millennium House, which predates this Council and has dragged on for far too long. However, this is very far from being the only problem which our Parish faces. In addition to the other work that the Council currently performs, there are many important issues affecting us - drastic cuts to our bus service, threatened changes to GP services, reduced access to domiciliary and social care affecting some of our most vulnerable neighbours - the list goes on. I wonder what a community manifesto for Pensilva and St Ive might look like? My hope is that the Parish Council elected in May will establish much closer links with the community it serves, by undertaking regular community consultations, by working closely with local groups and by whatever other means are necessary.

I propose that all of us willing to stand for election, and who agree broadly with the ideals I have outlined above, could agree a platform of improvements to work on, for the benefit of our communities. If we work together in this way, there is no end to what we could achieve to make our villages more vibrant and more resilient. I would be most unhappy if people got elected just to forward one part of the agenda and then resigned, as that would open the way for unelected co-options once again.

I look forward to seeing a lively debate in these pages. Also, please do let me know if you think you might enjoy standing as a councillor and serving your community in this exciting next phase of St Ive Parish Council.

The defibrillator in Millennium House Pensilva is not available for public use unless Millennium House is open. The St Ive Village Hall committee are thinking about a publicly available defibrillator for the St Ive hamlets. Possible locations are; the old phone box opposite the Butchers Arms, outside St Ive Village Hall, outside the Methodist chapel. The defibrillator would have to be linked

to a phone line so that the code to unlock the defibrillator can be obtained. Do you think this is a good idea, and where should it be located?

The plans for the Butchers Arms (Ref: PA16/07605 and PA16/07606) have been called in to the Conwall Council planning committee on 27th February at Luxtowe House, Liskeard. I will be speaking for the Parish Council which supports the opinion of the Butchers Arms Preservation Society that while we very much want the pub to reopen as soon as possible, the plans need to be in keeping with the existing listed building.

From Cllr Steph McWilliam - February 2017

I am going for a good news sandwich this month. Firstly, as I have said before, there are many things that Cornwall Council does well. My current favourite is a competition to build a rocket car with the prize being a trip to South Africa to see the trials of the Bloodhound programme. Many schools are involved with this and it is a great way to encourage the study of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects. I have stood next to the Bloodhound at an Expo at Newquay Airport last year and can assure you it is even more impressive close up. Good luck to everyone involved. Now the negative part of the sandwich. I really cannot understand why people who have picked up dog mess and put it in a plastic bag then decide to leave it hanging in hedges or on gorse bushes. You have done the worst part so why not take it home and put it in your dustbin? There are a couple of places where this is getting to be a really big problem. The dog enforcement officer has been asked to monitor the situation and I am also trying to get signage up and considering if I can find funding to have some CCTV cameras installed. I also had a dash cam for Christmas and have a camera on my phone, so can I assure everyone that I will not hesitate to take photographic evidence to the police and enforcement teams if I get the chance? This really needs to stop. As ever, I'm sure it is a very small number of people causing a problem for the majority.

One example of the wonderful work that goes on in the background is the Cornwall Fire, Rescue and Community Safety team calling for people to recycle unwanted mobility aids. These have been collected in and some are now being used in Kenya, thanks to a partnership with Disability Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly. We have many staff who quietly get on with activities to help people, not just in Cornwall but across the world.

The work to review the number of councillors and the way Cornwall is governed goes on. I am concerned that there seems to be a push for the number to be reduced significantly. Whilst most of you won't need to contact me at all for the whole four years of this council, some really do need help and it is getting harder to speak to an officer directly because of the funding reduction and changes to the staffing at our council offices. As we don't have District Councils, there is a good chance that we could end up with the highest number of electors per councillor in the country. I really don't see why your vote should be worth less than voters elsewhere. The changes won't come in until 2021 so this has no bearing on the elections in May this year, just in case anyone thinks I've started campaigning early! We are really into winter now so can I please ask everyone to think about their neighbours, particularly if they are elderly or vulnerable, and take a minute to check on anyone who might benefit from a call? February is often our worst month for bad weather and consequently for accidents and illness. Please look after yourselves and the rest of the community where you can. Thank you.

Our two new bikes are now installed and in use, thanks to the High Down Wind Farm Community Fund, alongside the Lottery-funded equipment that went in previously. We now have just one recumbent bike left to replace and we are almost half way there, thanks to

a generous grant of £500 from the Norman Family Trust.

We are also finally able to announce that we have appointed a new member of staff. We are delighted to welcome Dylan Peel, who will be covering the Monday and Wednesday morning shifts from the first of February. Dylan is highly qualified for a young man, and will be able to take over the GP referrals immediately. He lives in Darite and was a member of All Being Well back in his teens. He is now captain of



the Pensilva FC first team. In all we had twenty applicants for the position and Dylan was our choice from a shortlist of four. On behalf of the ABW membership - welcome Dylan, and good luck!

In the gym, the Bonfire of the Calories challenge has been going during January and has once again proved popular with members determined to work off any Christmas excesses. This is also the time of year when we collect annual memberships, which gives a much-needed boost to the coffers. Finally, it's good to be able to say that we are in a stronger position financially at the start of 2017 than for many years past. So it's all positives this month!



THE SEEDS ARE HERE. This year's (enormous) seed order has arrived from Tamar Organics and we're starting to organise them in order of planting, starting very soon with new potatoes in the tunnel for that extra early crop. Our friend Amanda Hignett from I Love Nature at Upton X will propagate special crops like chillies, peppers, aubergines, tomatoes that did so well last year for being able to get going early with some heat. And then all the other usual things; garlic, courgettes, golden beetroot, peas, beans, lettuce and sweetcorn, that make summer such a delight.

VOLUNTEERING AT THE GROWING PROJECT. We have a lovely group of volunteers and you are very welcome to join us. While the winter months are still with us, we will only meet on a Weds 10am - 2pm. In March we will start the Thurs session again as we get into full swing with our planting. Soup and bread is served for lunch.

CROPS AND PLANTING. We have purple sprouting broccoli to come from March till May, with kale, leeks, chard and cabbages still standing. We have decided not to grow main crop potatoes this year as they take so much space, but new potatoes are such a treat that we shall be planting many more than we did last year. We planted some crops much too densely last year, not realising how much more productive our new raised beds would be. As a result, various rusts and moulds got hold, so I shall leave plenty of space this year and hope to avoid that. We shall soon see whether our overwintering mulching has maintained soil health as we hope: fingers crossed that we find lots of worms and microbes when we fork the soil over for planting in a month or so time.

OUR VEG BOXES were enormously popular over Christmas and the number of deliveries remains vibrant. To enjoy fabulous fresh local fruit and veg, delivered to your door every Wednesday afternoon, order your mixed veg box now. Prices are: £7.50 for 1 /2 people, £10 for 3/4 people, £15 family box and the very popular £5 fruit bag.

OUR VEG STALL has also increased in popularity every month, which is very gratifying. It is refreshed with all sorts of seasonal delights every Thursday. Please put your cash in the post-box on the gate.

COMMUNITY COMPOST SCHEME We welcome your lawn clippings, used rabbit bedding, cuttings, etc at our compost bins by the gate. If you use weed-killer on your lawn, please dispose of your clippings through the Council scheme.

A YEAR OF ACHIEVEMENT FOR NIKKI WELCH

Special Olympian, Nikki Welch, from Pensilva is celebrating another successful year, this time as a newly promoted level 6 badminton player.

Playing for England in the Scottish leg of the Home Nations challenge in February Nikki won silver in the singles, silver in mixed doubles with new partner, James Pert, and gold in the ladies doubles.

In June Nikki travelled up to Sheffield to compete in the English leg where she won silver in the ladies singles and gold in the ladies doubles with partner Dee Holly Weiner from Exeter.

Next came the Welsh leg, played in August at the Sport


Wales National Centre in Cardiff. Nikki won gold in the ladies singles, finally beating Scottish champion Jenny Grey 21-18 and 21-12. She then went on to take gold in the ladies doubles final. In a thrilling mixed doubles final Jenny and her partner Michael McCraw had to settle for silver against the Scottish pair, narrowly losing by 21-18, 19-21 and 21-23.

Nikki's next event, in October, was played in Bournemouth, where she outplayed all comers and collected the ladies singles gold medal. She then went across to Lisburn, Northern Ireland in November, to compete in the Irish leg of the 4 Nations event. Here she won gold against the new Irish champion, Sarah Louise Rea, and gold in the mixed doubles with partner James. Nikki was unable to play in the ladies doubles, as her partner suffered an injury, but was awarded a silver runners up medal, which Nikki

gave to an athlete who hadn't won any medals but had competed and had impressed with their sportsmanship.

Nikki trains with the Liskeard Junior badminton all-inclusive club in Lux Park on a Monday night and has additional coaching with Malcolm Cooper in Millennium House, Pensilva. She also practices with the Pensilva veterans in Millennium House on Monday and Friday evenings. Her fitness training at All Being Well at the centre has improved her stamina. Nikki would like to thank all that have helped her achieve her ambitions.

A big thank you to all customers at Angie's café at Millennium House who donated towards the Special Olympics Cornwall team that will be travelling to Sheffield in August to compete at the Special Olympic National Games. A total of £135 was raised to help with transport, accommodation and kit.



Pensilva W.I Report for the January meeting

Iris Merriot was the speaker at the January meeting of Pensilva W.I. She gave us a fascinating talk about her life making costumes for the theatre, bringing along samples for us to try on if we wished. Iris lived in London as a young girl and remembered the devastation of the war and the air raids. She has always loved sewing and started making cloths from the age of nine. After her marriage, she and her young family moved to Canada. She had already trained and had done a 4 year course in tailoring. When in Canada she decided to do a 2 year course in theatre costume design, at the end of which she made an 1820 costume including a magnificent corset. The costumes were beautifully made and had to be strong enough to stand up to the rigours of the theatre. The patterns for the costumes had to be made from only sketches and drawings and had to fit perfectly. She also spent 20 years making wedding dresses and she showed us photos of the beautiful dresses she had made for her daughter and granddaughter. She has also been involved with making costumes for Sterts Theatre and the Menheniot-based Camp Theatre. Iris was warmly thanked by Frances Tucker for such a fascinating talk and for bringing along such a wonderful selection of costumes.

The High Down Wind Power Community Fund shall exist for the promotion of projects, with priority given to the Parish of St Ive, with potential for the improvement of environmental education in the face of climate change, highlighting the need for sustainability, for renewable energy and energy efficiency, or which address problems of rural isolation, especially for younger members of the community or projects which otherwise address local needs. Examples of projects could be a youth project wishing to extended their range of equipment or a community hall requiring repairs etc. Grants range from £250 - £3,000.

The Cornwall Community Foundation (CCF) administers this grant programme and are welcoming applications for the next round. The deadline for applications is on the 6^{th} February 2017 followed by the panel on the 6^{th} March 2017.


Pensilva Memory Café
