2	<p>Apologies for absence were received from Cllr. M Carr and P Dipper.</p>	
3	<p>Councillors Declarations of Interest. To receive and grant any requests for dispensations. None declared at this stage of the meeting.</p>	
4	<p>To receive comments or questions from members of the public. None.</p>	
5	<p>Minutes – to approve the Minutes of the Meeting held on the 28th June 2019 The Minutes of the Meeting held on the 24th May 2019 were approved and signed by the Chairman; proposed Cllr M Corney, seconded Cllr N Libby and agreed by the majority. Cllr P Haimes did not attend the 24th May meeting.</p>	
6	<p>Matters Arising from the Minutes. Item 7 – ROSPA report. The report was discussed along with the repairs required to the surfacing. The Clerk had emailed a contractor but received no reply, to date. Item 8 Belmont Park – Nothing to report. Item 11 – Hedge trimming – Cllr M Corney offered to assist the landowner with the trimming of the hedge at Keason if required.</p>	<p>Clerk</p> <p>MC</p>
7	<p>To receive an update on the parish footpaths – report / actions. P Dipper was unable to attend this meeting. A list of materials required was being drafted.</p>	<p>PD</p>
8	<p>To list any unrecorded paths and decide whether or not these need to be registered. A list of unrecorded paths was written in the back of the footpath report compiled by Cllr M Corney and P Dipper and sent to Cornwall Council. Cllr P Haimes identified the green lane between Gang and the top St Ive road. Cllr M Corney reported that the Climate Emergency Group were encouraging paths to be used.</p>	
9	<p>Recreation Field and Play Area, Pensilva –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Pensilva Football Club – The Chairman stated that contact with the football club was needed to enable the two organisations to work together. The Clerk had emailed the secretary of the football club and awaited a reply once their committee had met. o Communications with the football club, advertising and pre-season requirements. There was a lack of response from the football club on previous requests. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Football Club stand, security and maintenance. The football club will be asked to close the stand (fit wire gates) when not in use to stop the anti-social behaviour occurring in the building. ○ Storage container – to be repainted or removed. The container had been moved but not painted. ○ Perimeter advertising boards. Then number of advertising boards adjacent to the goal posts had exceeded the amount permitted by the Council. Boards will be removed to allow the Carnival Week celebrations to take place with some being relocated to the top fence and others stored in the shed. These could be replaced at the start of the football season. ○ Advice on fixture list for the forthcoming season. A fixture list will be requested. <p>It was noted that the club gained a lot from Millennium House and its' facilities but were longer supporting the building by using the bar on match days. It was suggested that a charge be made for the use of the field in addition to the amount paid for the changing rooms.</p>	
10	<p>St Ive Recreation Field – to establish a regular grass cutting regime for the field. The field at St Ive had been trimmed. Cllr N Libby offered to speak to the local contractor to establish a regular cutting regime during the growing season, up to the end of September. The Clerk had received an email from a resident of St Ive stating that her young boys could not use the football area because the grass was too long. Barry Pollard continued to maintain and strim the area around the play equipment and picnic bench.</p>	
11	<p>Overgrown hedges and response from residents contacted. Reported under Item 6 of this meeting.</p>	
12	<p>Update on the reply from the Land registry relating to the ownership of the fields linking Goodmans Lane and Belmont Park. The Clerk will contact Land Registry.</p> <p>Any other Business:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Planting of trees – Cllr A Moss reported on the scheme by the Woodland Trust where trees were available, free of charge, to plant in the community. Sites identified that could take advantage of this scheme were the burial ground, the corner at St Ive Recreation Field, and the park at Pensilva. The hedge at Slade Road could have additional trees to fill in between the existing species. Cllr N Libby could accommodate some trees on his agricultural land to create a wooded area. b) Pensilva Recreation Ground - It was suggested that Cornwall Council had expressed their thoughts about handing over the quarter of the field to the Recreation Ground charity. c) Tidy up day – The date of Thursday, 4th July 2019 was agreed for a “tidy up” day prior to Carnival Week.
