

<u>Reflections on Lockdown from the "virtual school</u> <u>gates" from some Pensilva primary school mums</u>

With the village school closed, many parents have missed the camaraderie of chats at school gates. In place of this, I have been lucky enough to have met regularly with mums online for "virtual school gates" chats. Through this unprecedented time, we have shared fears and hopes, tears and giggles, as we juggled our parental responsibilities. With so many people suffering loneliness and isolation, I have been particularly grateful for the support and fun that these meetings have provided.

Here I reflect on the highs and lows of lockdown based on these precious conversations. What have we learnt? What are we grateful for? What could have been better? What does the future hold for our children and our community?

As lockdown eases, are we rushing back to resume life as it was or is this a chance for a total reset?

What have we learnt?

Most importantly we have learnt how to use Zoom. We spent our first evening, logging on and off and giggling about how tricky it all was; we are now very slick indeed at virtual meetings.

We were all deeply afraid when coronavirus hit the UK and we were told to stay at home. However, we quickly noticed that the new quieter simpler way of life was surprisingly less stressful than before lockdown. Not driving around the county, rushing to school runs and activities. No deadlines, no pressure. Just living in the moment for the first time ever. This was strangely comforting in the face of what appeared to be an apocalyptic time.

We learnt to slow down. To be present for our children. In turn, the children re-learned how to play. Family life seemed to go back in time.

We learnt to make do. With the need to limit shopping to essentials, we learnt to create meals from those foods lurking at the back of the freezer. We discovered baking without flour and some even learnt how to make crisps.

We all learnt how to grow more vegetables, discovering pleasure in gardening for many of us for the first time.

We have learnt to home-school our children while also working from home. This has been a challenge for all of us. The children have learnt to be more independent and imaginative. They have learnt more life skills like cooking, cleaning and gardening. "Reflections on lockdown" Continued from previous page

What are we grateful for?

We quickly realised how fortunate we were to live in such a wonderfully supportive community. I remember the letter from Millennium House that arrived on our doorstep as we were self-isolating due to feverish children. The warmth that I felt from knowing the team at Millenium House had taken the trouble to let us know they were there to help was so very reassuring. So many have gone on to benefit from this wonderful outpouring of community spirit. The volunteers who have delivered prescriptions, shopping and even just dropped something in the letter box to say "hi" has been lovely to see. We all agreed that we were very lucky indeed. Thank you to every one of you.

We are grateful for PE instructors. Not all of you may know, but the likes of Joe Wicks (aka "The body coach") and even our own local PE teacher Mr Oli Jones were quick to provide daily morning virtual work outs for our children. This was such a positive way to start the day, giving us all a much-needed structure. It also helped our fitness and emotional wellbeing. Mr Jones is a wonderful role model for so many of the local children and he gave them focus, motivation and hope during those frightening early weeks of lockdown. For many of us mums we have been fitter than for years and this will benefit both our health and that of our families. Thank you Mr Jones .

Never a conversation passed between us mums without expressing our eternal gratitude and amazement at how helpful the village shop has been. We have always been able to find what we needed for our families. We have been so appreciative of the warm atmosphere, despite such stressful circumstances. Thank you so much to all the team at Pensilva Stores for keeping us supplied and for keeping us safe.

We have been grateful for human connections. Strangely, many of us are now better connected to those we care about, near and far, than before lockdown. As we can't have physical contact it has been as easy to connect with someone local as to someone far, far away. This opportunity to refocus on those relationships which really matter in our lives by reconnecting with those people has been something we have been very grateful for.

We are grateful for the peace in our village, for the quietness that enveloped the village during lockdown. No thrum of cars as they rattle over the cattle grid on the moor. No revving of engines. No rumble of planes overhead. Just the bleating of sheep, and Oh! the birdsong in the morning, an orchestra of beautiful sound.

We have been grateful for laughter. Whilst talking online, we have laughed until our tummies hurt, well into the night. The company of good friends never seemed more precious than during those early weeks of lockdown. "Reflections on lockdown" Continued from previous page

We have been grateful for neighbours. We have exchanged seeds, tips and jokes from neighbours. We have checked up on and looked after each other.

Amongst my neighbours, we established a "WhatsApp" group. It has been wonderful to connect with neighbours with whom I never spoken despite well over a decade living together. It gives a warm sense of rootedness to be surrounded by such care and kindness.

What could have been better?

The death toll due to Covid-19 has been terrible. We have lost local people. Additionally, everyone will know someone who has been lost to non-Covid related illness during this dreadful period. There is so much sadness as funerals and grieving have been sustained in isolation. This will have longlasting repercussions.

Some of us have made huge sacrifices during this time. Keeping away from loved ones for the sake of not spreading the virus. We have experienced heartbreak and grief. It has been more difficult to endure these hardships when rules have been flouted locally and nationally, diminishing the earnest efforts of those brave people around us.

At times we have felt guilty that not all of us were on the front line. We had to remind ourselves that we have all had a part to play. Supporting our families and community, keeping well and limiting the spread of the virus have been our roles.

The children have been afraid and isolated despite our best efforts to reassure and love them.

The church has stood empty. I passed yesterday and it felt like a lifetime ago that we packed in there for Christingle, shoulder to shoulder to hug, kiss and wish each other a merry Christmas.

What does the future hold?

As we stagger blinking into the light, we are all re-evaluating and reorienting ourselves.

We're facing recession on the back of environmental instability. The future is uncertain and grey but somehow it doesn't seem as scary as before.

We know there is more goodness than bad in our lives. Our community is strong, we have friendship and love to face the next chapter.

The threat of illness is a great leveller. We now have all known what it is to feel very vulnerable and have learned to live with more kindness and less judgement. Can we keep this in our hearts as we readjust to our new "abnormal"?

My Preparation for Lockdown

In 1965 Rhodesia declared itself an independent state. I found myself on a Royal Navy ship off the port of Beira. Britain had imposed sanctions and we were preventing illegal goods going through the port to Rhodesia. We would spend six weeks on patrol then go to a port for a few days to collect stores, mail and to do essential maintenance before returning for another six week patrol. Before internet and mobile phones, and with very intermittent mail services, we felt very isolated, especially over the Christmas period.

In 1982 I found myself on a Royal Navy ship based in the Falkland Islands. Out of the blue came the Falklands conflict and we were left isolated in the South Atlantic with no base and pursued by enemy forces. Once again, no internet or mobile phones to keep in touch with families at home.

Apart from a few hours in Port Stanley after the recapture of the Islands we were 110 days at sea before returning to our home base at Chatham. While at sea the crew is split into watches so you only spend time with others of your watch, working and eating, so even on board we were isolated from those in the other watches.

So, when it came to "Lockdown", I felt that by divine providence I had been well prepared, but instead of being locked between steel walls with the constant noise of the ship's engines (I was an engineer) I was isolated in the beautiful Cornish countryside with the sound of birdsong to enhance the day.

It is recognised that for some this is a dreadful time of loneliness and anxiety, and the prayers of the Pensilva Christians go out to and for them. It is also recognised that we have been blessed with modern communications: internet, phones and, if all else fails, a reliable mail system (thank you postman).

During the Falklands conflict there was the fear of enemy forces; with the Lockdown we have the fear of the virus. One thing I observed with some of my Royal Navy friends was that, when we are frightened, we make bad decisions; something that can be seen in news reports. Having Jesus Christ in your life means that we are never really alone. Invite him in and he will stand by you and with you always, no matter what.

There are many things I miss:-

"Open The Book" sharing bible stories in school.

My Memory Café friends.

Sharing prayers in church.

The monthly pint in the Mel with the British Legion.

Being able to see my father in Kent.

Like all crises it will end, and then it will be up to us to make a new and better beginning..

From Rev Becca Bell

What possesses a vicar who is doing a job done by 6 men 20 years ago to dare to feel hopeful that, with no money, buildings that are all in need of varying amounts of work and care, and congregations that are definitely not getting younger, we have a a whole load of achievable opportunities before us?!

I recently sent a letter out to those on the electoral role for my churches updating everyone with news as to what is going on with the churches. In it I suggested that when we return to worship things will be different.

St Cleer and St Ive shared an organist, and sadly Sue has decided to resign her post. She has enormous talent, a fab sense of humour, and a beautiful instinct for just the right music to enable worship. She is a true worship leader, which is a huge gift to any church and we will miss her immensely. I hope she might be able to pop back for occasional special events. Scratch choir anyone?!

Sadly the PCC at Menheniot has had to make the decision to close the mission chapel at Merrymeet. The chapel has been there since the beginning of the last century and was built to enable the farm workers at that end of the parish to get to church on Sundays. It has a thriving congregation, but the roof is failing rapidly and the grant funding we had hoped to get is not possible. We had been exploring the possibilities for repairing the roof and enabling the chapel to continue its mission for the last 3 years but lockdown accelerated the decision, along with quite a few slates falling in a storm. We are aware it is a matter of time until we need to shut the building for safety and so have moved to begin to process of closure. This will include a chance to consult with the community. We need to find around £150,000 to repair the roof which we know we cannot fundraise.

We want to put people before buildings. Jesus once criticised the Jews for putting laws before human need, and it would be sad if we put the needs of buildings before the needs of our congregations. Our buildings are there to serve the congregations and communities, and when they are no longer fit for purpose we must ensure our first priority is to the congregation. The PCC and I will be working with the congregation to look at "what next" for Merrymeet folk.

Despite the sad changes, coming out of lockdown also gives us huge possibilities and opportunities and I do dare to hope! The congregation from Merrymeet will be working towards a new beginning, our churches will have to discover what their patterns of prayer and worship will be, and we need to look at how best we can serve our communities in very difficult times of economic hardship. There are tough things ahead, but they bring opportunity.

Before Covid-19 we can all accept that we were living unsustainably. As a planet we were consuming resources too fast and killing our environment. As individuals we were damaging our mental health by driving ourselves into the ground with frantic lives and ridiculous expectations of ourselves and those around us. We know all this, and yet there is a real danger we could slip back into the same patterns after lockdown without thinking. The church is no different. We have been living unsustainably for years trying to keep the same level of ministry and the same number of buildings going with ever diminishing finance and with it, diminishing ministry. So here I am, a vicar with 6 churches across 4 parishes, wondering how we can come out of lockdown in a better state than we went in.

I have huge hope, that if we can be brave and really think about what we want church to be then we can come out of lockdown and be a church that can thrive and grow and look forward with hope to the future. We have, as churches, perhaps been afraid to admit that we didn't really know how our churches could still be here in ten or fifteen years time. But I really do believe that if we can consider what is really important to us, and work together as a cluster, we can develop patterns of worship, ministry, and outreach that are both sustainable, and allow us to hope for the future. It might mean less frequent services, more informal gatherings, and meeting at times that are not Sunday morning. It might mean different styles of worship, and finding ways to better serve our communities (which will also mean people stepping up to help make this happen!).

Please start praying and thinking now about what the most important aspect of church is for you, and what you dream for your church family for 5 years time. And then let's start thinking about how we get there. If we want church to stay the same forever, then we risk losing it altogether. If we can imagine changes that enable us to keep the important stuff, then there are some great opportunities to grow our church communities, and to better serve our parishes.

Services currently available from St Ive and Pensilva parish churches.

St Cleer church has been our "guinea-pig" in trawling through the paperwork to explore looking to open for prayer. They have managed to sort things out to open from the 4th July on Saturdays from 10-12 and Tuesdays from 2-4pm.

It is going to be a while longer before Pensilva Church can open, but hopefully not too much longer! Meanwhile, you might see Geoff catching up on the gardening outside!!

St lve Church is unlikely to open for prayer for now, but we will keep reviewing things.

We have a study course exploring prayer via Zoom. Again, email Becca to join.

- We are conducting funerals for limited numbers as we have been throughout lockdown. We are now able to hold funerals inside the church but with no singing.
- We can now conduct weddings for a limited number of guests. We are still able to make arrangements for weddings next year and beyond.
- We are currently unable to do Christenings but if you want to contact Becca with your details, she will be in touch as soon as we are able to start arranging them.
- We have been making headway with the project to update the heating. Hopefully we might be warmer this winter!

Middle Hill Farm pond and Wildlife Habitat

Design Statement:

This wildlife pond has been designed taking into consideration the local flora/ fauna and will contribute to regional and national targets for the Pond Habitat Action Plan and the Million Ponds Project, enhancing the local biodiversity. The purpose is only to benefit wildlife and for the enjoyment of our family.

There are NO intentions to use this area commercially, nor will it have any adverse effect on species and/or habits concerned. The site will be enhanced with a pond and have no negative or detrimental effect on the local wildlife, trees or neighbouring properties nor will it harm the character or appearance of the area.

The pond will measure approximately one third of an acre, will have shallow sloping sides with native aquatic planting and emergent vegetation to blend in with the existing landscape. An underwater bar/ shoal and/or hibernaculum will be created for protection of invertebrates and amphibians over the winter months and the perimeter edge irregular to optimise areas and interest for wildlife.

Native aquatic planting will be used throughout the ponds edge grown in the shallow areas to help stabilise banks and provide important food sources for aquatic and terrestrial insects. Emergent vegetation will be planted to allow dragonflies and damselflies to emerge from the water and metamorphosise.

The design and delivery of this new habitat has been conducted under the watchful eye of Aquatic Consultancy ensuring everything which is carried out is done so with the best intentions of all wildlife at the forefront.

One third of ponds are believed to have disappeared in the last 50 years or so across the UK. Of those which remain, more than 80% are thought to be in poor condition. This has had an enormous impact on wildlife, particularly amphibians. Under the banner Just Add Water, a national campaign has been launched to increase the number of ponds. The Pond Conservation Society, along with Natural England, is promoting a related scheme called The Million Ponds Project. The SSDC Guide to Good Practice – Landscape Design states that, "it is important that Wildlife Ponds' significance, both for nature conservation and amenity value in general, is realised." It goes on to state that, "the formation of well-designed new ponds will be encouraged". The proposed scheme fully supports the Pond Habitat Action Plan which states that, "all proposals for development ... will ... maximise opportunities for restoration, enhancement and connection of natural habitats ... and ... incorporate beneficial biodiversity conservation features where appropriate."

We thank you for your understanding whilst we create this space, weather permitting the excavation works will be complete in early July, we hope to have the area planted shortly after and the space will once again be green.

- Anybody who receives a letter from the NHS recommending selfisolation.
