

Anything we can do to reduce unnecessary water consumption will make a significant difference. Parish Council planning meeting.

A public meeting at Millennium House, Pensilva, on April 4th, 2023 at 7 pm will consider the following planning application:

PA23/01485, Amanda Smee, Land opposite unit 25 Pensilva Industrial Estate, St Ive Road, Pensilva – Outline planning consent for an affordable housing, rural exception scheme of up to 46 dwellings with all matters reserved, except for access.

This is the proposed development for the land between the Pensilva Industrial Estate and Amanda Way. It has a fairly lengthy history and has been the subject of much speculation and comment, in and around Pensilva, for a number of years.

While I am very far from being an expert on the issue (or on planning matters in general) I have been in touch with people who know a lot about the case, and I can see that there are complex and emotive issues involved. I would urge anybody and everybody who has an interest in the matter to try to attend the meeting. This could well be your best chance to listen to the facts and come to an informed opinion about the pros and cons of the proposed development. Speaking for myself, documents I have seen and conversations I have had during the last few days have caused me to adjust my views more than once. I feel that we owe it to each other, as a community, to come together and discuss issues such as this in a mature and sensible way, and hopefully to unite around a common position.

While it is the job of our councillors to make the final decision about whether to recommend planning applications, or not, or something in between, I feel sure that they will want to be aware of, and take into consideration, the views and feelings of our community when taking important decisions. It would not be fair on them to expect them to do otherwise.

I hope to see you there.

THIRTEEN+ YEARS OF WILDLIFE WATCHING IN THE PARISH OF ST. IVE Since moving to the Parish at the end of 2009, I have been photographing and recording the wildlife which I see at my home on the edge of Pensilva on a daily basis. This month I will tell you a bit about a bird which we only see in our garden at this time of year ...

... THE MALLARD DUCK



Mallards have come to our garden pond every year bar two, since we moved in. It is always a pair and they seem to use our pond for courtship and once for mating. We think that from 2010 - 17 it was the same pair, which seemed to gradually get used to us appearing as time went on. This culminated in 2017 when they stayed right through to breeding and were seen for 25 days instead of the 5 - 7 days until then. We watched intrigued and amused as a ritual developed with the female leaving the pond on a fixed route out of the pond, over flower beds

and under the bird feeder where she fed briefly on fallen seeds before completing her circuit back into the pond. At all times, she was closely followed by the male, just a few feet behind. Although we only observed the mating once, a pattern of this activity followed by about 24 hours absence when she would go to a nest she had made of leaves and grasses lined with feathers and set a little way away to lay an egg and cover it carefully to protect it from predators, before coming back to repeat the process. (If you should stumble upon a nest with eggs but no duck, please leave it as it is very rare for her to abandon her nest and she will almost certainly come back.) We occasionally heard soft quacking noises from below the house, but never found the nest. We last saw the female on the 3rd of January, when she would have gone to brood what may have been 12 or more eggs. A couple of days after hatching, she would have led them away - possibly to our neighbour's pond which is much bigger than ours, so giving better protection from predators to the ducklings. Ducks are capable of producing 2 or 3 broods a year, sometimes using holes in trees. She can lose more than half her bodyweight during laying and is dependent on her mate for protection. Finding a nest site (particularly in towns) can be difficult leading to some unusual sites such as a balcony several floors up!

The male (drake) remained for a few days initially following his mate's route alone but appearing less and less as time went by. He would play no

more of a role in looking after the young and would gradually lose interest and go off to join a group of males. These groups can sometimes indulge in what can only be described as gang rape of any nearby female. I have seen this when out walking in other parts of the country and it can be a pretty violent affair leaving you wondering how she didn't drown!





I'm sure you will be familiar with the appearance of this bird, but it is worth saying that the plainer brown female is less distinctive as other ducks also use this strategy

of a plainer brown female who will be better camouflaged when on the nest and is a sure sign of a species where only the female incubates the eggs. The above photos illustrate the effectiveness of this strategy.

Mallards eat plants, seeds berries insects and small fish or tadpoles. I have also read that they can eat acorns.

In winter, their numbers are boosted by migrants from France and the Netherlands and stretching east to the Baltic States and on to Finland and Russia. Mallards are not classified as 'of concern' globally, but UK breeding pairs decreased over the 25 years up to 2015 and so are amber listed here.

If indulging in the age old activity of 'feeding the ducks', please remember that although bread is not harmful to them, it does tend to fill them up without providing the nutrition and vitamins they need and excessive feeding of bread can lead to malnutrition. It's a lovely way to introduce children to wildlife but needs to be in moderation only.

To complete our story, after the bumper year of 2017, we were mallard-free for two years. They then came back again, though I think this is a different pair as they are much more skittish than the others. At the time of writing, we have seen them on 5 separate days, always at dusk or early in the morning.

St Ive & District Gardening Club Report - March 2023

On Monday 6th March we had a visit from Tony Faul, a Landscape Historian, who told us the stories of two Cornish Marys from the 18th Century, Mary Delany and Mary Bryant. They were from very different backgrounds and lived very different lives. As Tony pointed out, history is about ordinary people's lives and all our stories will be part of history when we are gone.

In the 18th Century women had no rights, not even over their own children, and were expected merely to serve their menfolk.

Mary Delany was born in Fowey in 1700 to a wealthy family; her father was an MP. At the age of 7, Mary was sent to live with her aunt in London, to learn to be a lady who would grow up to attract and marry a rich man. At 16 Mary fell in love with a clergyman, Robert, but he was too poor for Mary's family to agree to the marriage. Robert died broken-hearted, not long after.

Mary's family decided she should live in Longleat with her uncle, Lord Bath, where she could easily meet a rich and suitable man. This turned out to be the 60 year old MP for Launceston, Alexander Pendarves, who was very rich and, according to Mary, 'a fat man' man. As Tony explained this was a time when women didn't make their own choices; Mary's uncle was delighted to agree to the match due which suited the family's interests. Mary described the marriage as 'being led to sacrifice'. When Alexander went to London for work, Mary begged him to take her too. In London Mary attended fashionable events, where she met younger men, but Alexander was worried Mary would leave him and he made her promise not to in return for leaving everything to her in his will. Not long after, Alexander died after an evening's drinking. But he hadn't changed his will, so Mary was left a poor widow.

Mary moved back to London where she mixed with a very fashionable crowd of famous people. One such was John Wesley. They spent time together and Mary had expectations, but John Wesley was more interested in leading the Methodist movement. On one of many visits to Ireland, Mary watched the very first performance of Handel's Messiah! In Ireland, Mary met Dr Delany, another clergyman from an ordinary background. Once again Mary's family were not impressed & were against a marriage. This time Mary decided not to listen; she followed her heart and married him. When Dr Delany died in 1768, Mary moved in with the Duchess of Portland. They both had an interest in gardens, flowers being Mary's favourite. She began making mosaics from tissue paper; they looked like real flowers pressed on a black background. These are now in the British Museum. Mary was a friend of the royals, who bought her a house.

In short, Mary Delany had a wealthy start, mixed in high circles and her crafts are in the British Museum. In contrast...

Mary Bryant was born in 1765 in Ladock but moved to Fowey with her family as her father was a seaman. At 17, Mary moved to Plymouth with a friend to find work but this didn't work out. They ended up robbing a lady and were caught. Mary sentence was initially execution, but this was commuted to transportation. Whilst in prison Mary became pregnant. By 1787, America was independent, so Mary was sent to a new and virtually unknown place called Australia. Even the Captain of the ship didn't know where he was going but was promised that if he captained the ship he would become Governor General of Australia. During the 8-month voyage, Mary gave birth on the ship to a daughter called Charlotte and met a fellow- convict called William. *Continued on next page...*

The new Governor General declared that convicts could marry other convicts, and Mary needed a man and a father for Charlotte, so married William. William continued his criminal ways and took more fish than his allowance, for which he was flogged almost to death. Mary realised that she had to do something for herself & her daughter. A 2nd convict ship arrived but the men on the ship were worse than the ones she already knew! Mary stayed with William, and they joined forces with others to look for a better life elsewhere. Having heard of a Dutch colony in another area of the country, the group formulated a plan to move there, which involved William stealing a boat. Miraculously, the group made it to the colony and were welcomed – a better life lay ahead, or so they thought. A British fleet arrived. Showing off, William became very drunk. He was reported to the authorities and put back on a ship to London. By this time Mary had a son as well as a daughter; going back to London no better off than when she left was not what she wanted for her children, but she had no choice. During the journey, the family became ill. By the time the ship reached London, William and both the children were dead. Only Mary survived.

Mary's story reached James Boswell who was a friend of the Home Secretary. James asked that Mary be pardoned as she'd lost so much, and she was. James Boswell found her lodgings and Mary had a better life, but once again this did not last. James met her sister and decided he liked her better than Mary. Mary's mother fell ill and James saw his opportunity to be alone with Mary's sister. He sent Mary back to Falmouth to care for her sick mother. Whilst Mary was in Falmouth James sent her money, but when he died the money stopped. Mary Bryant's story ends there; we know nothing more about her.

Did the two Mary's meet? No one knows but there is an extraordinary link: While on the convict ship, Mary Bryant sewed scraps of material together to create 'The Rajah Quilt.' Some of the scraps of material feature the designs of Mary Delaney's paper flowers.

Who would have thought that Cornwall would have its own elite secret army! Well Adrian Wilton came along to our meeting to tell us all about it. Our Foodbank needs you!

In 2021 the local Foodbank helped 2789 people; in 2022 this number leaped to 4124.

All of us are only too familiar with the energy crisis and the escalating cost of living, particularly the cost of food. And this is reflected dramatically in the amount of work done at the Foodbank these days. Over a thousand people were helped during last December alone. Christmas is often a difficult time financially, of course, but last Christmas over three times more people were helped than in December 2021.

Last year, Liskeard & Looe Foodbank moved from its site at Barras Place in Liskeard to new premises. It needed more space to cope with the increasing demand and now has two sites: Client Services, at 21 Dean Street (at the back of the Westbourne car park, on the right of the Co-op); and a warehouse, at Unit 2 Trevecca Industrial Estate (off Culverland Road).

We are immensely grateful to all of you whose generosity has allowed the Foodbank to keep up with this rapid growth in local need, in the face of an economic crisis which affects almost all of us...... Now we need your time!

Parish Lift Share

After our article in the November Pump one local resident got in touch to tell us about Liftshare. He says;

"I joined Liftshare. All I had to do was enter my journeys and travel times, which resulted in one "Buddi", who lived in Callington - we both worked in Torpoint. If I had still been working in Plymouth, there were many possible solutions. We used to meet at St Ive, and on a good week, we both were driving twice a week, saving two journeys each or 90 miles a week. My Buddi only worked half a day on Friday, so there were only four days available to share. If one of us had to use a car during the day, we did the driving. It saved an absolute fortune. The beauty of Liftshare is that you can choose whether to accept or decline a Buddi. This can be used for infrequent or regular journeys, even going shopping, and if individuals do not have computer access, there are options at Millennium House."
