Another improvement for the parish is to produce a Neighbourhood Development Plan, which was expertly outlined last month.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan will set out the vision for an area and the planning policies for the use and development of land within our Parish or Neighbourhood Area.

It can establish a vision for an area, include general planning policies for the development and use of land in a neighbourhood and they can allocate sites for development. They should be about local rather than strategic issues.

The plan can also guide future development and can include policies addressing details of what new development might look like such as design and density. So, its important that the Community pulls together to have an influence on the developments in the Parish.



All patients submit an AccuRX patient triage from their smart phone or computer, the link for which is on our website.

If you do not have a smart phone or are unable to do the online form you can call the practice and the reception team will complete the form on your behalf.



All clinical patient triages are reviewed by a GP.

All triages will be looked at the same day and responded to within 72 hours, unless deemed urgent.

# TREGÓVENEK

(next to Pentiddy Community Woodland)

29th November, 2023 - Planting Hope with Muddy Hands.

Everyone at Tregovenek community farm was delighted to be awarded funding to work with the University of Plymouth through their *Get Involved Award* earlier this year. Researchers and students have been at Tregovenek and the neighbouring Pentiddy Community Woodland collecting data to measure how much carbon is being stored in the trees at Pentiddy, which are nowa 20 years old. The soils in the woodland and at Tregovenek are also being investigated to see how they differ and how they change over time with particular interest being on how the soil at Tregovenek will improve thanks to regenerative farming practices.

Children from Pensilva Primary School came and had a very exciting day with us on Nov 29th collecting some of the data and learning about the role trees and soils play in our changing environment. They also sowed tree seeds and started a tree nursery at the farm. Initially the trees that grow on in the nursery will be used to improve the





hedges around the land at Tregovenek but there is a hope to continue with the tree nursery to supply trees wherever they are needed in the local area.

20 years ago every child in the school came out to plant trees to help turn the bare field at Pentiddy into a woodland. It feels fitting that now, 20 years later, in line with Tregovenek's vision and values, the children are continuing to help create a better environment for future generations.

Sophie Faucet, the ecology professor from the university said "This project has been a great success. We look forward to continuing our collaboration with Tregovenek in the years to come." and Becky Palfrey, a teacher from Pensilva School said "The children really enjoyed visiting the farm and learning more about nature. They certainly learned about the importance of trees and how we need to work together to look after our environment. The children are really excited about returning to see if their seeds have begun to grow and it would also be nice to visit the farm during a different season."

Bringing people together to learn how we can work with each other and with nature is at the heart of Tregovenek's vision for creating a community farm. We're in the very early stages of setting up the farm so building these relationships is crucially important and we're off to a flying start!

## St Ive Community Orchard Report

Maintenance has to be the theme for the New Year.

It's now two years since we laid out the community garden boundaries, with gates and fencing. That deadhedge is now a lot thicker and better for wildlife. We'll probably be making it even better this month. It helps to support all sorts of diversity from fungi through insects to small rodents. Last winter it probably helped the harvest mice which we found two used nests of when scything the field in September.



My birdboxes need maintaining. This one is for house sparrows which like to live communially, as do other weaver finches. So I crammed a number of possible nesting sites into one box. Last winter I didn't get around to clearing out the previous year's nests, so this year Red-tailed bumbblebees set up home. They usually nest in the ground using old mouse holes. This choice was very unusual, but nature keeps on giving new surprises.

## 13 Years of Wildlife Watching

Since moving to the Parish at the end of 2009, I have been photographing and recording the wildlife which I see at my home on the edge of Pensilva on a daily basis. This month I will feature an infrequent but yearlong visitor to my feeders...







This is a striking little member of the finch family. As a guide, it is between the blue tit and robin in size. The males (like the one above) have bright yellow cheeks and breasts and striking yellow and black wing bars. The female (seen to the left) is similar, but without the black cap and with slightly more muted colours, but can also be identified by its yellow and black wing bars. As with most birds, the colours tend to be at their most vivid in the breeding season

Siskins are largely seed eaters, but supplement their diet with insects in the summer. For the

most part they eat tree seeds (including extracting seeds from fir cones), so their prime habitats are mixed and coniferous woodlands. The seeds of alder, birch, spruce and pine are all high on their menu. However, they do also use seed feeders in gardens. Interestingly, some studies have found that they are more frequently seen at feeders in wet weather (when pine cones close up) and less frequently when it is dry (when the pine cones open up). I shall be watching carefully to see whether this is true in my garden! Another tip I have picked up and will be trying out, is that they are particularly partial to niger seeds presented separately from the main seed mix. Siskins are acrobatic feeders and will hang upside down to get the best angle to extract seeds.




Siskins build their nests of twigs, moss and other soft materials in trees. They usually lay four or five eggs, which hatch in about two weeks. It is about another two weeks before they will fledge. Fledglings, like the one to the left, do sometimes appear on garden feeders. Whilst adults' main predator is the sparrowhawk, eggs and chicks are vulnerable to a wide range of predators.

The breeding range of siskins has enlarged over the years, firstly because of the expansion of coniferous forests and more recently because of their increasing use of garden feeders. They are found across the UK and the resident population (which does not usually migrate) is joined by migrating birds from northern Europe which will leave again in the spring. Individually, a siskin has an expected lifespan of two years

Traditionally, the best time to see siskins was in winter from New Year on, because of the raised numbers at this time. However, their increasing use of bird feeders has evened things out a bit. The chart below shows that here on my patch in the parish of St Ive there is still a skew to the winter months, though they are seen throughout the year apart from the autumn when many species become scarcer visitors while they are moulting at the end of the breeding season.

Chart showing siskin sightings from 2020 - 2023 compared to the 2010 - 2023 averages.



Now the leaves have fallen, the tops of trees are good places to spot siskins when you are out and about. Their population is doing well with at the moment with a 61% increase recorded between 1995 and 2015. However, that would change if we do not maintain and expand the woodland habitats they rely on.





## Neighbourhood Development Plan

#### What is a Neighbourhood Development Plan?

A Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) is a community-led framework for guiding the future development and growth of an area.

It may contain a vision, aims, and planning policies that relate to the use and development of land and linked social, economic and environmental issues. It may deal with a wide range of issues (like housing, employment, heritage and transport) so long as they can be influenced by statutory Planning processes.

St Ive and Pensilva Parish Council is the local "qualifying body" in planning law that has the power to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan for our area. The Parish Council is keen to make sure that local views and considerations are taken into account when it comes to future development within the Parish. The Plan is being written in partnership with the local community through the St Ive and Pensilva NDP Steering Group which is made up of a committed group of Parish Councillors and local residents.

A survey to gather the thoughts of all local residents, businesses and community organisations will be held later this year to gather the information needed to write the Plan. It must also take into account government policy and local economic, social and environmental conditions. When the draft Plan it is ready a formal 6 week community consultation will take place, following which it will be submitted to Cornwall Council.

The Neighbourhood Plan will go through further consultation, an independent examination and then a local referendum before it is approved in law. Once our Plan has been approved, it will become part of the formal planning system and be a 'material consideration' for planning applications, alongside national and Cornwall Local Plan policies.

#### Why do we need one in St Ive and Pensilva Parish?

A Neighbourhood Plan for our parish would allow residents to develop planning policies that reflect our own priorities and help to deliver the kind of community that we would like to see in the future.

Once in place, the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan will be used to help Cornwall

Council's Planning Officers, Councillors and Planning Inspectors to decide whether future planning applications should be approved or refused.

It will mean that local views MUST be taken into account when planning decisions are made.

The Neighbourhood Plan will also help the local community to set out any projects that it would like to see happen over the coming years.

#### What is a Repair Café?






