Letter from the Editor

With the election mere days away and purdah laws still in force, I wanted to take a break from my usual waffling, and write something useful instead. Bit unconventional, I know, but let's try it.

Fraud is now the most common offence, and with every service moving online, vulnerable people falling victim to digital scams is increasingly common. So here are the digital scams that you should be on the lookout for in 2024.

If it helps just one of you, I'll be happy.

Thank you for your purchase! (Wait, what purchase?!) You receive an email thanking you for your purchase or subscription to McAfee Antivirus, or Best Buy Geek Squad, or some other nonsense you don't recognise and certainly didn't sign up for. \$300! That can't be right! (And yes, these emails usually show \$, not £).

Luckily, there's a phone number listed on the receipt, and a helpful message telling you to call that if you've changed your mind or need to cancel. You call it, and they're all too happy to oblige—just tell them your credit card details so it can be reversed.

But you don't recognize the purchase because you didn't make it, and the receipt is fake. The phone number to cancel is the number of the scammers, and you've given them your credit card details, so this time, you'll get a actual

fraudulent purchase on your account.

What to do? If you get an email about a purchase you don't recognise, you can safely delete it—or if you're worried, check your account statements. Whatever you do, do not call the number to cancel. If you have actually had fraudulent activity on your account, phone your bank—they will deal with it.

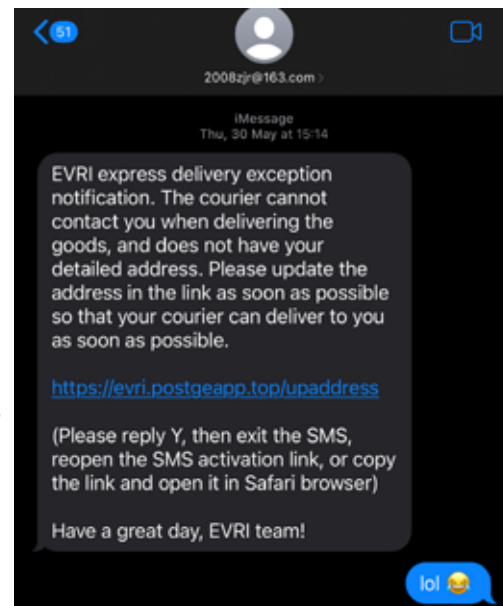
The unexpected bank transfer. You wake up to find £1000 has been transferred to your account. Later you get a call or message explaining the terrible mistake, and could you please transfer it back?

Don't—even if it looks like it came from a friend. It was a fraudulent transfer from a hacked account. The bank will eventually reverse the transaction; don't touch the money, don't spend it, don't attempt to send anything back by yourself—just let the bank handle it.

You might also be asked to accept a transfer on behalf of someone else - they'll say you can keep 10% as a handling fee.

That makes you a money "mule". Again, not only will you lose the full amount because it'll eventually be reversed, you'll also have your account frozen, and a fraud marker added, making any kind of finance impossible in future.

Your Evri delivery was unsuccessful, click here to rearrange. You were expecting a parcel anyway, right? You click and enter your card details to confirm your identify, or perhaps to pay the small re-delivery fee. Whoops. What

follows is a series of fraudulent purchases on your card.

Don't click links in a text message. Banking, parcels, anything—just don't. Go to the official website. It's at that point you'll realise this missed delivery doesn't even have a tracking number, because it doesn't exist.

Your windows computer has a virus. You get a call from Microsoft. They've detected a virus on your computer! Oh no! Not to worry though, just go to this website and they'll be happy to remove it for you. You do as they say, they take control of your PC, type some random commands into a prompt window, and it's all good, they tell you. Huzzah!

But now they have full access to everything on your computer; they've installed further backdoors and password stealing software that mean anything you do on your PC is now compromised. Your bank account will be cleared out next.

Protect yourself: Microsoft won't call you, ever. Your PC doesn't have a virus. Hang up, or leave them on the line while you have lunch.

In fact, while we're on the topic, anti-virus software like McAfee and Norton is completely unnecessary. The computer shop or tech guy that sold it to you only recommended it because they get a cut of the sale. Windows has competent built-in anti virus software called Defender, and has done for over a decade.

Pig Butchering: so-called because the scammer will often spend weeks or months fattening you up for eventual "slaughter". You get a text or WhatsApp message out of the blue from an unknown number; they seem to think you're an acquaintance. You tell them they have the wrong person. They apologise, but say you sound nice and strike up a conversation anyway. Or perhaps you meet someone on a dating app;



the set up doesn't matter, but it's usually a romance scam.

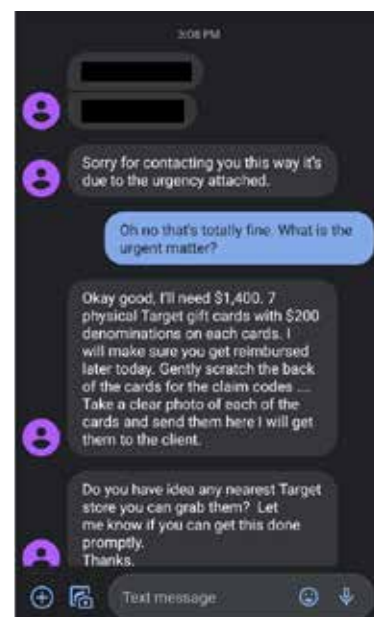
After a while, they explain that they've been making great returns on some investment, and would be happy to share details. You're intrigued, but not stupid. You invest a small amount just to see how things go. You login to your new investment dashboard and see some fantastic returns already—up 20% in a week! Wow, it's legit! So you put some more in... a few thousand pounds this time.

After all, you can login to the system, see it's making a return, so this obviously isn't some scam or they'd have run off with your money by now.

Soon, you want to withdraw some of those profits. Only, you can't. It says you need to pay a small withdrawal fee to do that. So you pay the fee, and you still can't. The investment wasn't real, the dashboard showing your returns was fake, and there was never any chance of getting your money back (or making any sort of returns). It's all gone.

Protect yourself: This might sound a little misanthropic, but always ignore random strangers who text you out of the blue. Especially on WhatsApp. If the "investment" involves cryptocurrency of any kind, run a mile.

One last thing: if you have fallen victim to a crypto investment scam, especially if you talk about on your social profiles, you'll soon be targetted for a second round by the recovery scammers, who promise to get your investment back (for a small advance



fee). That's not possible. The money is gone.

Your boss needs a gift card, urgently. You get an email from your work boss. They need an iTunes gift card for their daughter's birthday urgently; would you be so kind as to run out and get them? You can just take a picture of the code and send it via email. The email seems to come from their legitimate address. You do as asked, but then get a funny feeling, so you phone your boss to check, and he knows nothing about it. You're down £50 (or worse) because you bought a gift card for a stranger.

Protect yourself: email addresses can be superficially faked very easily, and sadly, email providers like Outlook/BTConnect are useless at showing you when this happens. Gmail wouldn't even let those fake emails into your inbox. The biggest red flag though is the mention of gift cards—it's an untraceable method of scamming anyone without the technical complexities of cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin. (Don't get me started on Bitcoin, we'll be here all day... eugh)

Sextortion: I left the most insidious until last. If you have teen children or grandchildren, take special note, because they're the target of these type of attacks, and it can be absolutely devastating beyond monetary losses. It's a simple scam in the age of multiple online chat platforms: they strike up a conversation with a cute girl or guy online, who sends them some ...revealing photos. The person isn't real of course; the photos and profile picture are stolen. Your child trusts them because they're a friend of a friend (of course—being a "friend" in an online chat space is meaningless when all it takes is a single click to become one). But they ask for a naughty picture in return, and your child obliges. The scammer then demands money, or they'll send the photo to everyone in the chat room or on your child's friend list. They might even have tracked them down and be threatening to tell parents, family, and school friends.

This is the most serious of scams, and they've been many cases of children taking their own

lives because of the threats.

If your child falls victim to this: You might be tempted, but don't delete the photos that your child shared. Police can create a digital fingerprint to automatically detect and remove whenever shared online (the photo itself won't be saved by the police, just a one way "fingerprint" of the file that can't be used to reconstruct it). Save all chat histories, and report it all to the police. Immediately stop all communication with the scammer, and block them. Chances are they won't follow through with the threat, but will give up and move onto the next victim.

Protect yourself: it's easy to just say "*don't send dodgy pictures of yourself to anyone!*", but it's a natural desire to want to reciprocate, especially at an age where you're desperate for validation and hormones are running wild. Even adults fall victim to this on dating apps, but they can protect themselves by at least meeting someone in person first. An uncomfortable conversation is the only way to protect against this one.

It's easy to get angry and wonder what kind of evil people would do this. In truth, many are scammed into doing it themselves. They're lured to neighboring countries with the promise of legitimate jobs; their passport is then stolen, and they're trapped in secure compounds with heavily armored guards. Unless they hit targets for numbers of victims, they're beaten and tortured. It's just another form of modern day slavery.

I mentioned before the threat of AI in making these scams more realistic and more dangerous—such as with voice cloning technology—but thankfully we haven't yet seen those in real world usage. For now, those appear to be too much effort when the classic scams are still working well.

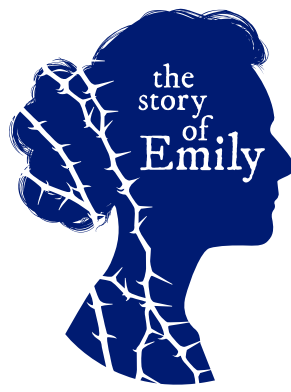

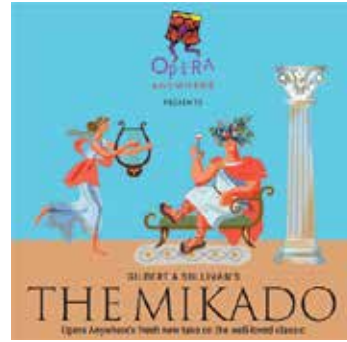

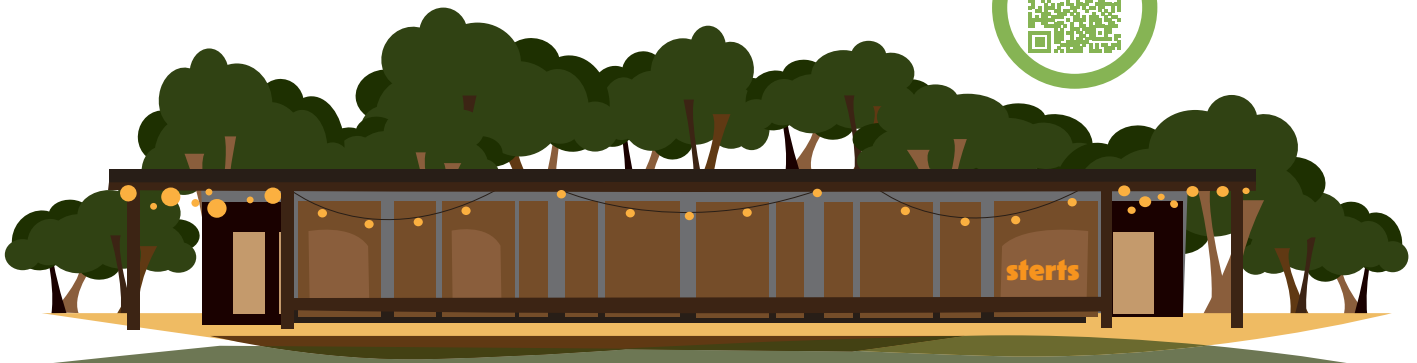

Update on Aid for Ukraine

I am pleased to report that Tim Johnson and Steve Preston from Nightingales UK, are currently in Ukraine and have successfully driven and delivered a second-hand ambulance to Kyiv, packed with medical and humanitarian aid.

The people of Ukraine report that the situation is desperate but they are filled with hope when they receive these vehicles. They find renewed strength, faith and courage to continue on, knowing that they are supported and are not alone; rekindling their belief in a better tomorrow.

They are also deeply appreciative for the combined effort from all those who support their cause. This is an extract from a text sent by Tetiana to Tim at Nightingales:

"Tim, very soon you meet my family, you will see how we are so grateful! Maybe they cannot say it in words, but for sure you will feel it!!! It means such a lot to us! We don't want to give up but it is difficult for us. People like you bring new energy, new life, new breath and we can keep going. I hope that one day we can do the same for your country, with new experience and new knowledge."

Ukraine is frequently referred to as the breadbasket of Europe, due to its excellent growing conditions for wheat. Their significant production of grain is a vital link in the global food security chain. Africa and the Middle East rely heavily on its exports but since the beginning of the Russian invasion in February 2022, Ukrainian production of grain has been severely disrupted. Keeping Ukrainian grain flowing remains crucial for global food security.

It is important to understand that if Russia



were to achieve victory over Ukraine, there would be a vastly increased threat to the rest of Europe and a mass displacement of millions of Ukrainians fleeing their country.

I cannot convey enough my deepest gratitude to all those in our village who believe in and support this cause. YOUR generous contributions are making a huge and vital difference. THANKYOU.

Our next aid collection from the Millenium is scheduled for the weekend of the 22nd of July. I shall be holding a table top sale at the Pensilva Carnival on the 20th of July, to raise funds for Nightingales; to support their ongoing expenses. Please come and say hello and pick up a bargain.

The cost of purchasing a second-hand ambulance is £5,000 and Nightingales are continually looking for unwanted long wheel base 4 x 4 vehicles that have a minimal amount of tax and MOT; which can be donated and driven one way filled with aid. These vehicles act as ambulances to rescue military and civilian casualties from the front line once they reach Ukraine.

Gardening Club Report

On Monday 3rd June we visited Lametton Mill near St Keyne. Some of you may recognise the name or know it from being on Channel 4's Grand Designs. Leigh and Richard had quite a story to tell....

We arrived to the welcoming faces of Leigh, Richard, and their two wonderful dogs. The garden starts on the driveway, a striking area with the house leading away from the road. The openness showcases the layout which Leigh took from her mind to reality.

We started with a talk from Leigh and Richard on their journey from a derelict mill and space to a home and delightful garden.

In 2017 Leigh and Richard set eyes on an unloved, unwanted and truly uncared for mill. Without looking inside (which, after seeing the photos, was actually wise because I'm certain it wasn't safe by any means) they decided to purchase it. As these things usually go, it didn't happen quick, months went by until they became owners. Even more time went by until they could move in, let alone start the garden! The mill was nothing more than a shell, it had been stripped of it's original metal works; all scrapped for the cash in the 1960's. A true meaning of the phrase "clean slate". The outside area was equally blank but in Leigh's mind it was a 'blank canvas' on which she began to paint a garden of calm, ordered wildness and a compliment to the old mill.

The garden has a flowing, gravelled pathway which seems to be a nod to the waterway the mill would have used when it was in its prime. Lining the pathway is a wired wall filled with stones from a local quarry, the colours matching the walls of the mill to link them together. The walls are holding in the plant and flower beds which are filled with carefully chosen plants to bring Leigh's vision to life. Height has been used to match the towering trees and mill. Naturally growing foxgloves line the garden's border with the neighbouring property proudly showing off their pink trumpets. Rose bushes are in abundance throughout the garden, blooming away in their groups of yellows and pinks. The large Californian poppies provide the focal pop of colour at the bottom of the garden.

As we walk up the top of the garden it strikes me the difference in this garden to others is that the slopes are planted & the flat sections are lawns. We could look down through the flowers, seeing each one having its moment in the line of sight. Dotted throughout the garden were the stunning spheres of the purple flowering onion.

Beside the mill was the most vibrant copper beech tree, the leaves were perfect, the copper red colour being shown off with help from the vast fern at it's base. The contrast in colour was breathtaking. The

other contrast in the garden was the foxglove growing from the wall of the old wheel pit.

The feel of the garden was serene, peaceful & perfectly fitted the surroundings. In the valley between the lonely mill site, for Leigh and Richard it was love at first sight...that love is now there in the transformation for everyone to see.

THIRTEEN+ YEARS OF WILDLIFE WATCHING IN THE PARISH OF ST. IVE

Since moving to the Parish at the end of 2009, I have been photographing and recording the wildlife which I see at my home on the edge of Pensilva on a daily basis. This month I am looking at one of the most familiar birds on our feeders...

...THE GREAT TIT



Checking through my records, I was amazed to find that, on reaching my 40th article for 'The Pump', I had not yet written about the great tit, one of the most frequent visitors to our gardens and especially to our feeders. It is the largest member of the tit family found in the UK. It has a yellow breast, with bluey-green tints on its back. It has white cheeks, and a black hood which develops into a wide black band down its breast, clearly seen



in the above photo and this is probably the most helpful identifying feature. The wings and tail are bluish, leading some to confuse it with its smaller cousin, the blue tit.

The great tit can be quite aggressive at the feeders, pushing in front of its many smaller cousins. All the tits (often joined by other frequent feeders such as chaffinches) will descend on the feeders together. Gradually all appear, go backwards and forwards between the bushes and feeders for some time, before gradually all leaving - I assume to see what's on offer next door!) This behaviour

will give them an element of 'safety in numbers'. It is an extension of their behaviour in wilder habitats, where they will also move around in mixed flocks.

Great tits eat mainly insects and invertebrates such as caterpillars, grasshoppers, flies and spiders during the warmer months. Berries and seeds provide an important dietary supplement in winter when invertebrates are scarce.

Great tits laid their 7 - 8 eggs in April and May with the young hatching about 2 weeks later and fledging 2-3 weeks after that and may go on to have a second brood. This means that now in July there are many fledglings and juveniles about and you may see them on your feeders, still begging food from their parents by fluttering their wings. In the nest they will largely have been fed caterpillars. As natural cavity nesters, using holes in trees, they take well to nest boxes and I frequently see them when checking dormouse boxes under licence.



This bird flattening itself against the ground in 2018, may have been on an ants nest, using the ants to rid it of unwanted parasites. I have observed this in other species such as blackbirds, but in this case did not see ants where it had been, so cannot be certain.

Great tits can be found in woods, farmland and parks as well as our gardens. With an estimated UK population of two million birds, they are not considered to be under threat. However, a closer look at the figures shows that from the sixties, there was a steady increase in numbers until about 2007-2010. Since then the overall trend has been a decline, with some fairly marked annual variations, probably because of the less predictable weather conditions we now experience. Various studies have looked at what might be driving this change, but there are no clear cut conclusions. Interestingly, research has shown that UK birds have developed slightly longer beaks from the seventies than their Mainland Europe relatives. This may have helped them to gather more food, so explaining the initial increase in numbers which started about then. Hopefully they will grace our bird feeders for many years to come!

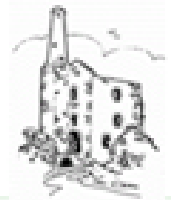

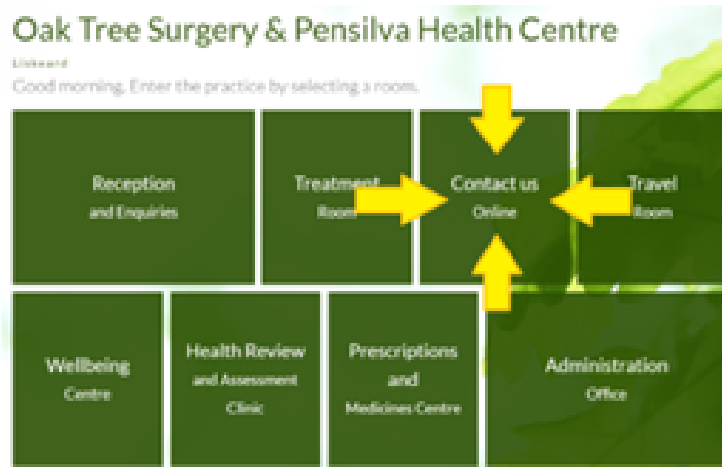

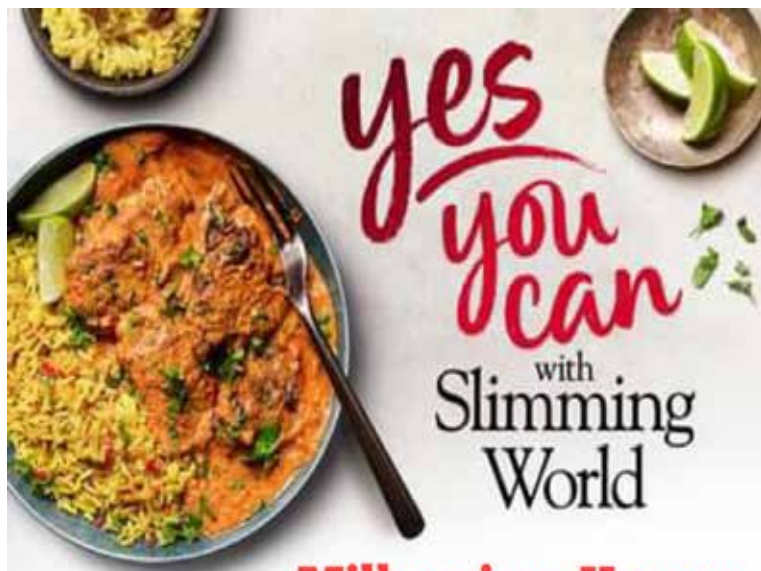
