Letter from The Editor

Did you know: Pensilva sits alongside sites like Mont-Saint-Michel and the Great Barrier Reef as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Seriously?!

Well, we're part of one, anyway: the **Cornwall and West Devon Mining Landscape**, designated in July 2006 in recognition of its outstanding universal value and pivotal role in powering the Industrial Revolution.

Between 1700 and 1914, Cornwall's mines and pioneering steam-beam engines drove innovation worldwide, and yielded two-thirds of global copper at their peak. Cornish copper and tin literally wired the world: from naval hulls to telephone lines, canned food to steam engines. Cornish mining technology and skilled "Cousin Jacks" spread across Australia, South Africa, Mexico, and beyond, forging new industrial paths with Cornish know-how and engineers.

Today, all we see are the remnants: leaning engine houses, rusted train lines, and holes in the ground that sheep remain unreasonably drawn to. But these aren't just ruins; they're the bones of a time when this landscape helped shape modern civilisation.

UNESCO calls this area "the most authentic and historically important components of Cornwall and West Devon mining landscape." Every engine house, smallholding, railway, and deep shaft tells a story of ingenuity, industry, and stubborn Cornish grit.

But what's next? Does Cornwall, and Pensilva, still have a role to play beyond second homes and AirBnB for burnt-out city dwellers to escape to? I certainly hope so.

Enter Tregovenek, a community-owned project on the outskirts of Pensilva (technically St Cleer Parish, but I've always thought of boundaries as more of a suggestion). If you haven't heard, it's a community farm and gathering space rooted in permaculture, regenerative land-use, and collective work-complete with a composting facilities, community garden, silvopasture fields, workshops, and therapeutic spaces in a spirit of local renewal. Find out more at **tregovenek.org.uk**

If our mining ancestors powered the first world-changing revolution, perhaps Tregovenek is planting the seeds of the next; one built on community, wellbeing, the restoration of nature, and extracting plump carrots out of the ground instead of metal ore. Pensilva was part of a global revolution once-can we lead the next one?

Chairman's Column

On such a glorious day (which makes a change from the biblical deluges we suffered a while back), it is with reluctance and not a little anger that I must impart some bad news. A few days back, the Parish Council received the devastating news that all funding is to be withdrawn from Neighbourhood Development Plans (NDP). That news may not perturb too many of you but its effect in the future will certainly impact a good number of our residents.

These cuts have been inflicted by the very same government that wishes to build 1.5 million new homes—how will this be possible with no infrastructure framework in place? It's equivalent to asking someone to drive from here to John o'Groats and then tell them there's no fuel available, oh and by the way, you can't use your SatNav or road maps!!

It's not long ago since I wrote here about a potential new development of affordable housing for Pensilva. Our own NDP also would have included similar but smaller schemes dotted throughout the parish. The whole point of the Plan was to identify our housing/commercial needs and incorporate these needs into a document, fully endorsed by our residents through a programme of consultations, which ultimately would have been our "blueprint" for many years ahead.

Spare a thought then for our colleague, Steve Besford-Foster who has been working with the Parish Council for many months to produce this document. Only last week did he send out a draft version which runs to over 90 pages-yes, you read that correctly-over 90 pages and now it is virtually as nought. I certainly wouldn't have wanted to be in earshot when he learnt the news of this savage cut.

I think I've gone on enough on this subject so for a complete change, as you know July is a very important month in the village as it has a whole week of Carnival–that's probably better than Rio de Janeiro!! Let's hope the weather is as fabulous as it is at the moment. Let me take the opportunity of wishing you all a great time no matter what the weather. Just be warned, I may put in one of our dogs into the dog show. This is a guy who won "Most Handsome Dog" at the Royal Cornwall Show a year or so back; he hasn't lost his looks!!

Others went on a walk to Kerdroya—a Labrynth at Colliford lake—and enjoyed the craftsmanship of the hedges, the many plants, and abundant wildlife around the route. Members also enjoyed an evening meal at Wheal Tor to celebrate the Pensilva WI birthday in May. A real variety!

John Gilbert then took us on an incredible journey from the top of the North Island to the bottom of the South Island of New Zealand. He showed beautiful pictures of just how much earthquakes have shaped the landscape. With his wife, Julie,



we followed as they explored via canoe, on foot, cable car, bus and on bikes, up mountains, getting up close to geysers, tunnels, and exploring the towns

along the way. We were surprised to learn that there were just birds, reptiles and one NZ mammal, bats, until humans introduced others.

set up to save the indigenous nature population. We were captivated by just how fragile the balance between natural processes and the places we live can be, and how similar some of the rock formations were to those around us in Cornwall.

Community Speed Watch (CSW)

Liskeard and its surrounding areas have had an active Community Speed Watch group for over 10 years whose sole intention is to try and make local roads a safer place for all to use.

The team founded to encourage as many drivers as possible to be more speed aware when driving through Liskeard, Dobwalls, Doublebois, East Taphouse, Fore Down, Menheniot, Merrymeet, Pensilva, St Ive, Upton Cross, and Widegates.

They operate from police authorised monitoring sites which are chosen so they are clearly visible to approaching motorists and are placed well within a speed limited area. When motorists see the team, they should already be aware of the road's speed limit and will have had plenty of time to adjust their speed accordingly.

CSW volunteers monitor the speeds of all passing drivers but only record those travelling at 10% +2 above the speed limit and report them to the police. The police write an advisory letter to the registered keeper, which explains the dangers of travelling at excess speed and reminds drivers to reduce the speed at which they travel.

Community Speed Watch volunteers do not fine or prosecute drivers and fully support this alternative advisory action being taken. They are also very thankful to the many drivers who they witness who do pass by, driving safely and within the speed limit.

Unfortunately, there are occasions when their volunteering work does not have the desired impact of educating motorists to drive within the speed limit, so the police will support local teams in delivering this message by conducting some enforcement action in the area as well.



St Ive & District Gardening Club Report

On Monday 2nd June we visited **The Real Food Garden** near Bodmin. We were greeted by Amelia, owner and visitor guide extraordinaire.

The evening had a summer feel with the sun setting on the horizon, that golden glow blanketing the crops. We walked to the start of the garden, overlooking perfectly lined rows of types of beet-Amelia confessed that this is not a strategy for growing, it is simply to look "right"! Amelia explained she found her love for gardening from her father, after she had resisted it, started university studying a totally

different subject but ultimately gave in to the fact gardening was actually her "thing" after all.

Training at RHS and the Eden Project, Amelia homed in on growing vegetables which could be her livelihood. It wasn't something new-it was simply going back to how life once was, trading at markets the produce grown in the garden, just on a larger scale. Now in the 9th season, an everexpanding garden serves the locals, passers-by and anyone else who comes across this delight. Amelia and her team are passionate about growing good crops; crops which grow naturally, to give people the best nutrients and taste how they should. Up against supermarkets, Amelia admitted it isn't easy, but staying true to their beliefs has gained them many loyal customers. The customers return and order the vegetable boxes, which are filled with seasonal vegetables, fresh and full of goodness.

Walking alongside the crops, Amelia explained that the work is not easy—it is all by hand, learning as they go, improving each year. The soil has proven to be a vital ingredient. No digging-the better the soil, the better the crops. Carrying out testing to ascertain the combinations. Rotation of crops has been extremely successful too. Amelia explained getting the balance right is very important: letting the soil "rest" but also using the soil when the plants aren't growing. As well intercropping, finding the crops and plants which support each other's growth. Tomato plants' photosynthesis adds sugar to the soil during the winter, for example.

Amelia uses natural pest control, attracting the predators to ward off the pests, but also having a



relaxed attitude to the pests has been a successful combination.

Walking down to the polytunnels, we heard about how difficult it can be to regulate temperatures inside. When do the doors need to be open, when do they need to be closed up at night or when it gets cooler–learning from the plants' reactions. Snails and slugs are denied places to hide and are given a challenge of a wood chip entry to the goodies inside the tunnels. A challenge which they rarely take on and win!

Around onto the non-crop area. We wander along the winding pathway lined with wild grasses and fruit trees. The reward is a pond-a pond which is the product of income from the vegetable boxes. Amelia believes that giving back to ecology and wildlife is important. The pond serves a vast array of wildlife: frogs, newts (which we were lucky enough to see), dragonflies, diving beetles, and water snails are a few.

We walk back up to the start and cross the road to the large field. Here we meet the chickens and the resident pigs-all of which are workers for the garden. The chickens are the providers of nitrogen for the brassicas; the pigs are natural ploughs and live compost bins! Amelia explained she visited Montenegro, where this type of growing is very commonplace.

The Real Food Garden is exactly that-it's real, it's food and it's a garden. A place where natural life is supported and very much encouraged for crops, fruit and wildlife.

FIFTEEN + YEARS OF WILDLIFE WATCHING IN THE PARISH OF ST. IVE

Since moving to the Parish at the end of 2009, I have been photographing and recording the wildlife which I see at my home on the edge of Pensilva on a daily basis. This month, I am looking at two birds which I find very difficult to distinguish. Is it a...





All the literature and published photographs seem to reinforce my doubts rather than clear up this dilemma! Both these members of the warbler family are described as small birds with greyish-green and white plumage with no striking features. The most distinguishing visual difference seems to be leg colour, with the with willow warblers having light brown legs and chiffchaffs black legs (though this can vary). Willow warblers have a slightly whiter belly. They both have a pronounced eye stripe.

All this leaves me as confused as ever, though my photos may indicate the slightly darker legs of the chiff chaff. However, angles, lighting and distance from the subject when photos are taken can muddle the issue. Both birds flick their tails, but the chiffchaff does this much more often.

Much more helpful would be their very different songs. The willow warbler has a very pretty descending song with a bit of a



flourish at the end. The chiffchaff's vocals consist of two repeated notes which give it its name. Both can be listened to on line, but as my sightings have all been from inside the house, it doesn't help me!

They are both largely woodland birds with only subtle and overlapping variations in their preferred habitats. Willow warblers can also be seen on open moorland (although I have not yet seen them when out walking on Bodmin Moor). Both birds eat a large variety of insects and spiders, caterpillars in Spring and berries in Autumn.

Both birds are migrants, with willow warblers heading for Sub-Saharan Africa for the winter, whilst chiffchaffs travel to either SE Asia or North Africa. However, there is a small but increasing population of chiffchaffs staying throughout the year.

Willow warblers build dome shaped nests with a single entrance hole in the side, close to the ground in scrub and usually with water nearby. Their tiny, glossy white eggs with reddish-brown speckles are laid in May or June. They are incubated by the female, but both parents will work to feed them.

Chiffchaffs nest at about the same time, also in dense undergrowth close to the ground

but in more open nests. Five or six white eggs with fine black speckles are laid and the chicks hatch around two weeks later, fledging after another couple of weeks. It is not uncommon for them to raise 2 broods in a year.

Whilst chiffchaffs are doing well, recent falls in the numbers of willow warblers (although still a common migrant) has put



them on the orange at risk category. It is a complex picture, as populations are declining in England and Wales but slightly increasing in Scotland and Northern Ireland. It is not yet fully understood why this is, but global warming may be a factor.

I hope that you will spot these endearing little birds and enjoy watching them despite their confusing similarities. Listen out for the song if you can. We certainly have at least one of them visiting us in Summer and may have both!

Update on Aid for Ukraine

On the 13th of June two members from the Nightingales team, Dan Halton and Ken Phillips, drove the 11th 4 x 4 vehicle to life-saving filled Ukraine. with Humanitarian Aid. This vehicle was handed over to two brave young men in Ukraine to be used for transporting and wounded civilians injured military personnel for emergency medical evacuation to hospital.



The month of May saw all sales from the items that were donated for the car boot sale and wooden box on my drive, rise to over £1,000 and at the time of writing this article on the 17th of June, I am very proud to say that we have just reached another £1,000, making our overall annual total to date £3,700.

The journeys that we make to Ukraine quite simply would not be possible

without the tremendous support that ALL of you have given. Every donation, no matter how big or small, makes a difference. We are so incredibly grateful, I cannot THANK YOU enough!

I am also excited to tell you about Ukraine Live, an event that is taking place at Yelverton Memorial Hall on the 27th of June. There will be live video feeds from Sumy, Dnipro and Uzhhorod, with the latest news and views from Ukraine. There will also be personal stories from Refugees and military personnel who are caught up on the frontline and how Nightingales UK are supporting the cause. There will be a question-and-answer session during the interview with Rupert Jones our speaker. Although this event will have passed by the time the July Parish Pump is issued, we are hoping to record the evenings events to be viewed on the Nightingales web page; which is also in the process of being updated.

The list of equipment and aid currently needed has now been revised. We can no longer take Wheelchairs, walking frames or crutches due to using smaller 4 x 4 vehicles. We drove our large van over to Ukraine at the beginning of the year, to be used for transporting the elderly and disabled to hospital. As space is of a premium, we can only now take the items listed.

As a group we are promoting the message that we need high spec medical aid and donations, ensuring that we can buy the very specific medical equipment needed to save lives on the front line. The need for unused and in date medication is as great as ever. If you have any medication that you no longer need or use, please consider donating it to Ukraine. All identification labels are removed and medication is checked by medical staff, prior to transportation.

I would be very grateful to receive any car boot sale items that you would like to donate; as I am running low on stock. There is a pink dustbin by the wooden box on the drive, outside my house where you can place your unwanted/donated items. For those of you who don't know where I live, our house is Rivendale PL14 5PG, located next to the Pensilva Medical Centre. At the time of writing this article, the Ukrainian war has now been going on for 3 years, 3 months, 3 weeks and 3 days. The Ukrainians fierce resistance to Russia's invasion has earned justified admiration. In the face of adversity, may the light of love and kindness shine brightly across the miles and illuminate the way forward for a peaceful outcome for all caught up in this conflict.
